Dear Colleagues,

The Polish Centre of Mediterranean Archaeology, University of Warsaw (PCMA UW), The Institute of Mediterranean and Oriental Cultures Polish Academy of Sciences (IKŚiO PAN), and The Levantine Ceramics Project ([LCP](#)) kindly invite you to participate in the next workshop on **Pottery of Graeco-Roman Egypt**, to be held in Warsaw on **Wednesday 10 July–Friday 12 July 2018**.

The goal of this meeting is to refine and expand the information assembled at the first [LCP](#) workshop devoted to pottery of Egypt, “Egyptian pottery in the Ptolemaic, Roman and Byzantine eras (4th century BC–7th century AD),” held in Athens at the Danish Institute of Archaeology in 2016. Since then, we’ve made many changes to the [LCP](#), of which the most significant is the addition of a map layer! On the website you can now see vessels, wares, kilns/workshops, and petrographic samples displayed on a map, and also search, display, and filter for similar items. To get the most out of maps, we need more examples of vessels – so **one goal of this workshop is to increase the number of individual vessel submissions**.

**A second goal is to complete the various ware pages for Egypt**, by adding more details in General Information and Descriptions. To this end **we ask that you browse the ware pages and choose one or two (or more!) to ‘adopt’ and fill out**. We ask that you make your choices and let us know by Feb. 1, 2019; and that you submit your information by April 1, 2019. We will organize sessions and make a program according to data submitted by that date.

#### *ABOUT THE [LCP](#)*

The [LCP](#) is a collaborative venture of archaeologists working throughout the Levant, from Cilicia to Egypt. The project website is devoted to information on ceramic wares, petro-fabrics, individual vessels, petrographic analyses, and kiln sites, dating from Neolithic through Ottoman times. The [LCP](#) is open access: anybody may consult the information here, and anybody may register and submit data, whether already published or newly discovered. The [LCP](#) is easily edited; contributors may modify, expand, or remove their own submitted information at any time. The [LCP](#) participates in the Creative Commons: every piece of information displays its contributor’s name and published references, when available. A citation link is provided for each page, so submitting information to the [LCP](#) provides contributors with an immediate digital publication.
